I am so pleased that Mr. Jackman has been finally officially honoured, albeit some 57 years later – never to late to right a serious wrong.


The Jackman relatives are so proud and wonder-struck with the recognition for Mr. Jackman, and with the treatment they received from your union members, and from your management throughout this entire process.
